








### Who is IRMA?

### Protection w/out condoms

- January 23 call between CDC, HIV Prevention
   Justice Alliance and other allies
- Discussed 2013 MMWR Report on HIV Testing and Risk of US Gay, Bisexual and other MSM <a href="http://www.cdc.gov/mmwr/pdf/wk/mm6247.pdf">http://www.cdc.gov/mmwr/pdf/wk/mm6247.pdf</a>
  - —86 community orgs sign on to letter critiquing language, testing recommendations, "unprotected sex"




### Protection w/out condoms


- Sex without condoms does not automatically = "unprotected sex."
- Will no longer frame sex without condoms as "unprotected."
  - Protection can mean VL suppression, it can mean sero-adaptation, and it can mean PrEP (in addition to male and female condoms)

Gay Men's Health Movement Key features of the gay men's health movement



#### Six principles of the gay men's health movement

1. Replace HIV-centric paradigm of health advocacy with holistic models that integrate (but don't default to) HIV

2. Exit crisis
paradigm, embrace
contemporary
understandings,
meanings,
implications of HIV
for gay men
of all colors & classes

3. Challenge deficitbased models for work w/gay men, replace w/assetbased approaches

#### Six principles of the gay men's health movement

4. Strategically, politically confront structural forces challenging well-being of gay men


5. Embrace "big tent" vision, respect diverse ways of organizing sex, relationships—shame, guilt are the health hazards, not specific sex practices, sex cultures

6. Launch only efforts that are neither overtly or covertly sanitizing, sanctimonious or moralistic

More concerted political advocacy is needed, including the articulation of the connections between ARV-based prevention and the ACA.




## Economic factors

Organizational changes in CBOs are widely anticipated to occur out of economic necessity and/or to maintain relevance in the ACA environment.













What is most striking is that [the] future is not driven by the science, it is driven by communities and the needs of implementation.










